Receiving E-mail on the Math Computer System

The Math and Computer Science computer systems are largely integrated — the functionality of the systems is virtually identical, and an account on one system works on the other.

However, the main computer system for checking e-mail is different on the two systems. On the Math system, e-mail is read on riemann.math.mun.ca while on the CS system, it is read on ganymede.pcglabs.mun.ca. The system to which your e-mail will initially be directed will depend on the circumstances under which your account was set up.

Fortunately, you can control the destination of your e-mail. Fire up a web browser and point it to

http://webtools.cs.mun.ca

Click on the second option: Utility for changing user passwords, mail forward and login shell. (If you are prompted to accept a security certificate, respond 'yes'.)

Now type in your login name and choose the third icon: **Change Mail Forward**. You should now see a field which will resemble the following:

Enter Mail Forward: shannons@math.mun.ca

or

Enter Mail Forward: shannons@pcglabs.mun.ca

If the e-mail address provided is username@math.mun.ca (where username is your username on the Math system) then everything is set up properly. If not, replace the given e-mail address with username@math.mun.ca — DON'T FORGET TO REPLACE username WITH YOUR ACTUAL USERNAME! Then type your password into the indicated field, and click on Submit This Form.

Once this is set up, you should be able to read e-mail either by logging onto riemann using the command

ssh riemann

and running the Pine utility (by typing pine at the riemann prompt), or by using the Webmail service at

http://www.math.mun.ca/webmail
