## **Introductory Number Theory**

**Problem 1:** For a = 4409 and b = 519, find the greatest common divisor and find x and y such that ax + by = gcd(a,b) by making a four-column table with entries  $c_n$ ,  $d_n$ ,  $r_n$ , and  $q_n$  as on page 24 of the course notes. (25 points) (This is Problem 11 (c) for Chapter 2 in the course notes. Similar questions are not unlikely to be on the midterm exam.)

**Problem 2:** Let  $\{f_n\}$  be the Fibonacci sequence, defined in Chapter 1 of the notes as well as in Problem 4 on Sheet 1. Prove that in finding  $(f_{n+2}, f_{n+1})$  by the Euclidean algorithm, n divisions are necessary. (25 points) (This is Problem 15 for Chapter 2 in the course notes.)

## Problem 3:

- 1. Let a be a positive integer different from 1, and s and t positive integers. Prove that  $(a^t - 1)$  divides  $(a^s - 1)$  if and only if t divides s. (15 points)
- 2. Prove that  $(a^m 1, a^n 1) = a^{(m,n)} 1$  for any positive integer a with  $a \neq 1$ . (10 points)

(This is Problem 16 for Chapter 2 in the course notes. At the end, the notes contain a hint for this problem.)

**Problem 4:** A man sold his sheep for \$180 each and his cows for \$290 each. He received a total of \$2890. How many cows did he sell? (25 points) (This is Problem 39 for Chapter 2 in the course notes.)
