Evaluation

Grades will be based on four reports (assignments). Both the information contained in the reports and the quality of exposition will be taken into account in the evaluation. There will be no final examination. The values of the reports are 15 marks, 25 marks, 30 marks and 30 marks for reports 1–4, respectively. The deadlines for submission of lab reports are given below. There is a penalty associated with late submissions resulting in a deduction of 5 marks per week (or any fraction thereof) for lateness. Consult the first section of the course manual for additional details.

An important purpose of the course is to learn technical writing. After each report has been read, you will meet with your instructor to go over your submission. A report is not assigned any grade until after this meeting has taken place. At this meeting, students must be prepared to explain the workings of any computer program submitted, and such explanations, if requested, may alter the grade on the project.
