WebAssign Information

An important part of your evaluation in Math 1000 will consist of a series of problem sets conducted via WebAssign, an online homework system. WebAssign gives you instant feedback on your work, enabling you to identify topics you may want to get extra help with (such as from your instructor or the Math Help Centre). WebAssign also provides various forms of additional help and practice, such as tutorial videos and supplementary exercises.
